Wessex Water is currently looking to provide a third pipeline to pump sludge to Berry Hill and negotiations are underway with any landowners affected to install this pipeline. This will reduce the 12 wheeled lorries using our local roads.

Stour River Bank

Certain areas of the Stour river bank have deteriorated, a survey is underway, and it may be possible to use people on community service to help with certain repairs.



Throop United Reform Church & Manse Muscliff Lane

Three separate Church authorities have shown an interest in this Grade 2 listed building and their information has been passed onto the Town Planning and a Special Projects Agent.

Bournemouth's Green Belt - Abolition of Regional Strategies

With the abolition of Regional Strategies by the coalition government it seems apparent that local councils still need to meet previous housing targets and are responsible for dealing with any planning applications.

4B Bus Service

Issues about the timings of this bus service have been forwarded to Transdev and transport officers at Bournemouth Council.

Main Weir Bridge, River Stour

The issues surrounding the safety handrail has resulted in scaffold poles being fitted as temporary support during September. Also green mesh fencing has been fitted around the small sluice gates in the interest of safety.

Muscliff Primary School - Expansion

The Expansion project was approved at the Council Cabinet on the 21st July 2010, using Government funding which has a strict deadline of being spent by August 2011 so the project can still proceed as long as this timescale is met.

Children's Strategic Services have submitted a pre planning application.

If the planning application is approved, and the timescales met to secure the funding, the school will benefit by having an 80 square metre additional hall built and 3 classrooms, allowing for 3 forms of entry of children per year, instead of only 2 at present.

This would allow the children's intake to be increased from 60 to 90 children per year for 3 years.
